- Chemical identification and uses: Ammonium dichromate is a bright orange red crystalline solid. It is readily ignited and burns producing a voluminous green residue. If heated in a closed container, the container may rupture due to the decomposition of the material. It may also act as a strong oxidizing agent if mixed with or contaminated with combustible material. It is reported to be used in photo engraving, dye mordants, pigments, oil purification, pickling, leather tanning, photography, process engraving, lithography, pyrotechnics, and glazes for porcelain and chinawares. It is also used as a nitrogen source and to make magnetic recording materials and in pyrotechnics, wood preserving, and lithography.
- Potential exposures: Exposure to Ammonium dichromate can occur in industrial/manufacturing facilities and/or during consumer use where the chemical solution is handled. Workers risk exposure primarily through inhalation and skin contact. Good manufacturing and industrial hygiene practices should be followed to prevent or reduce contact. - Human Health hazards: It is highly toxic chemicals and reported to be a Germ cell mutagen and carcinogen. It is acutely toxic via oral, inhalation or dermal route. It is reported to skin corrosive and sensitizer (skin and respiratory). It can also cause damage to eye. It is considered to cause reproductive or developmental harm based on animal studies. A harm could be toxicity to the reproductive system, including defects in the progeny and/or injury to male or female reproductive function. It is also an oxidizer and may intensify the fire. - Environmental Health hazards: it is not toxic to aquatic life but is not readily biodegradable and should not be released into environment.
